MINUTES OF THE WORK MEETING OF THE GRANTSVILLE CITY COUNCIL, HELD ON MAY 4, 2016 AT THE GRANTSVILLE CITY HALL, 429 EAST MAIN STREET, GRANTSVILLE, UTAH. THE MEETING BEGAN AT 6:00 P.M.

Mayor and Council Members Present: Mayor Brent Marshall and Council Members Mike Colson, Tom Tripp, Neil Critchlow, Jewel Allen, and Krista Sparks.

Appointed Officers and Employees Present: Chief Kevin Turner, Sherrie Broadbent, and Christine Webb.

Citizens and Guests Present: Steve Howe and Susan Johnsen.

AGENDA:

1. Discussion of City sponsored events.

Mayor Marshall asked Sherrie Broadbent what events the City sponsors each year. Mrs. Broadbent stated the City does the 4th of July, the East Egg Hunt (tentatively), the Night Out Against Crime, and the Memorial Day Program. Mayor Marshall asked what other events the Council wished to sponsor. Councilman Critchlow answered he would like to see the City sponsor the concerts we have down at the Clark Farm. Mrs. Broadbent said if the City sponsors the concerts, then the City employees will have to be involved with the planning and carrying out of the event. Mayor Marshall suggested having the concerts at the Cherry Street Park where there is a stage. Councilman Critchlow stated they don't need power; and the trees are there and everybody just likes it there. He asked what difference it is whether it is held at the park or the Clark Farm. Mrs. Broadbent asked if they charge for it or if it is free. Councilman Critchlow answered it is free. Councilman Colson asked if the City sponsors an event, does the City have to run it. Mrs. Broadbent answered yes, the employees have to be involved in the coordination and getting it ready and the actual doing it; it cannot be done by an outside group. She explained if money is being taken in or going out, it has to be done by the City. Councilman Tripp clarified these are insurance rules. Councilman Colson asked if there was any benefits for the Clark Farm to have the City sponsor it. Susan Johnsen answered yes; it means they don't have to buy insurance for the event. She explained they have not been able to purchase a comprehensive insurance policy. Mayor Marshall said he looked into having a movie night at the park for the kids. Councilman Tripp would like to discuss with the Council what events we really want to sponsor because the Easter Egg Hunt has been cancelled the last two years for a lack of volunteers. Councilman Critchlow stated he would like to have some events for the youth such as some kind of rodeo event during the 4th of July weekend and a movie night at the Cherry Street Park.

Mayor Marshall asked Sherrie Broadbent to go over some budget issues. Mrs. Broadbent said Building Inspector Mike Haycock's vehicle is getting old and not running as well. With the new part time building inspector, he would like to look at purchasing a new vehicle. Mrs. Broadbent provided information on new vehicles.

Chief Turner spoke on the proposed vehicle leases and purchases for the Police Department. He has three vehicles coming up on the lease. He would like to buy one vehicle and lease two new vehicles.

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Mayor Marshall asked Chief Turner to report on the Public Safety Building. Chief Turner explained the architect needs a decision on whether or not the Council wants a basement or not. The Council decided not to add a basement. Chief Turner reported on what the options are on the rec center building. He stated he had a meeting scheduled with the architect on Friday. Councilman Colson asked to attend the meeting.

Mrs. Broadbent reviewed the changes she had made to the budget since the last meeting. She said the donation requests had been received and those requesting donations had the opportunity to speak at tonight's City Council Meeting.
