**MINUTES OF THE WORK MEETING OF THE GRANTSVILLE CITY COUNCIL, HELD ON AUGUST 17, 2016 AT THE GRANTSVILLE CITY HALL, 429 EAST MAIN STREET, GRANTSVILLE, UTAH. THE MEETING BEGAN AT 5:00 P.M.**

**Mayor and Council Members Present:** Mayor Brent Marshall and Council Members Krista Sparks, Mike Colson, Tom Tripp, Jewel Allen, and Neil Critchlow.

**Appointed Officers and Employees Present:** Joel Linares, Sherrie Broadbent, and Christine Webb.

**1. Discussion of the Capital Facilities Plan.**

Mayor Marshall turned the time over to Craig Neeley with Aqua Engineering. Mr. Neeley reported the culinary water and sanitary sewer items had been worked on in the Capital Facilities Plan. Councilman Tripp expressed concerns about impacting our residents unnecessarily. Mr. Neeley said we are conservative on the proportionate fees. The Water Impact Fee is currently \$2,244 and the proposed fee is \$2,545.23. The Sewer Impact Fee is currently \$1,916 and the proposed fee is \$3,257.22. The Council Members spent time asking questions about the Capital Facilities Plan. Mr. Neeley provided answers.

**2. Discussion of the Main Street Cleanup.**

Councilwoman Sparks stated she has had citizens talk to her about sweeping the gutters and cleaning up the excessive weeds along Main Street. Councilman Colson asked if this is regarding personal property owners. Mayor Marshall reported he has had Enforcement Officer, Randi Johnson, remove yard sale and campaign signs on Main Street and the Maintenance Crew has been mowing the weeds. Councilman Critchlow commented on people putting their bulk garbage out on Main Street three (3) weeks prior to the bulk pickup day. Councilman Colson felt the City should actively enforce the current ordinance along Main Street. Councilwoman Allen made some suggestions. Among her ideas were: commending the property owners who have cleaned up their yards, Saturday clean up days, adopt a highway, rewards for cleanup, and hiring employees appointed strictly for Main Street maintenance.

**3. Discussion of the Historical Preservation Commission.**

Councilwoman Allen went over her proposal for a Historical Preservation Commission. The Mayor and Council discussed their ideas and suggestions. Councilwoman Allen will get the revised proposal to Attorney Linares.

**4. Adjourn.**
