# Spring 2016 Application For Street Trees

Residents and new home builders in Grantsville are offered the chance to buy and plant up to **two (2) street trees** in front of their homes. Half the cost of the trees is being paid for by the homeowner and half by the City of Grantsville! **Additional trees for your yard may be purchased at full cost of \$72.00 each.**

Number of Each Species Ordered: *Suggestion: Plant two or more of the same species in front of your home for balance.*

- \_\_\_\_\_ Regal Prince Oak- Height: 40'-60', Spread: 20' -Columnar growth. Good for narrow spaces. New this year.
- \_\_\_\_\_ Common Hackberry- (40'-50') Large, long lived tree , nice shape, very hardy. Excellent choice.
- \_\_\_\_\_ London Plane- Large (70'-90') On entrance road to South Willow Estates, fast growing with plenty of water.
- \_\_\_\_\_ Green Ash- (50') "Cimmaron"- Oval shape, showy foliage, strong storm resistance very hardy, very fast.
- \_\_\_\_\_ Crab Apple- (18') Stunning in spring, various colors, small fruit stays on for the birds. Good for our soils.
- \_\_\_\_\_ Linden- (40') Quality tree, good oval shape, fragrant little flower in spring, medium growth rate. Excellent here.
- \_\_\_\_\_ Honey Locust- (30'-50') "Imperial" fast-growing- Tolerant of alkaline soils. Graceful, thornless.
- \_\_\_\_\_ Canada Red- (25'-35') - Early green leaves turn dark purple. Showy flowers, strong, reliable tree.

Plant a Tree, Make Grantsville Green in 2016  
**Buy One, Get One Free**

Mayor Brent Marshall and Grantsville's City Council have again approved the "**Street Tree Program**" for planting trees in Grantsville for 2016. As in years past, to encourage the planting of more trees on the streets in our neighborhoods, the city will pay for one tree if you buy one tree. Both trees are to be planted on the street in front of your home or business.

In the past eleven years, over 1,600 large trees have been planted along the streets and in the yards of Grantsville to enhance neighborhoods and create a healthy urban forest. Grantsville City has been awarded the prestigious honor of being named a "**Tree City USA**" since 2003. The program, carried out by Grantsville's Shade Tree Commission, was established to encourage the planting of more shade trees along our streets. The popularity and success of the program is helping bring back the beauty of Grantsville's past, when hundreds of large trees once lined the streets of Grantsville.

The city also sponsors a "Poster Contest" for all 5th Grade students at both Grantsville elementary schools. Each of the 8 classes will choose a winning poster. Mayor Brent Marshall will award each winner with a larger tree to plant in their yard. This year's theme for the Utah Arbor Day Poster Contest is: "**Trees Are Terrific for Our Health and Happiness**".

The trees will cost less this year. Large trees are in short supply from the growers. As a result the size will be #10 but only \$72.00 each. They will be high quality, as always, and approximately 1 - 1.25" caliper. The city receives the trees at a discount from Tri City Nursery and get excellent value at a good savings to the City and to those who participate.

**Applications are available at City Hall and on the City's web sight.** This year's trees include: Crab Apple, Hackberry, Cimmaron Green Ash, Shade Master Honeylocust, Regal Prince Oak, London Plane, Linden and Improved Canada Red. **Deadline for the applications is Friday, April 22.** Trees will be delivered to the city parking lot by noon on Arbor Day, Friday, April 29, and must be picked up before 5 p.m.
