Mayor Marshall and the Grantsville City Council have approved the "Street Tree Program" for 2017. An application to purchase trees is included with this month's utility bill. The deadline for application is Friday, April 21st. Trees will be delivered by noon on Friday, April 28th and must be picked up before 5:00 p.m.

Avoid long lines! The Social Security Office will have a representative in Tooele the first and last Tuesday of each month from 10:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. at the Tooele Senior Center, 59 E. Vine Street. No appointment is necessary. Everyone is welcome. You will be seen on a first come, first serve basis.

We have seen an increase in dog attacks. If you are a dog owner, please take responsibility for your pet. Keep your dog contained or on a leash and never let it run unattended. You will be held responsible for any damage your animal may cause.

If you have a fire hydrant on or around your property, please clean around the area so that it will be visible. The Fire Department needs to have quick access to the hydrant when fighting fires.

We have received complaints about children riding OHVs at unsafe speeds and without adult supervision. We would like to remind parents to please be aware of the following OHV violations: Parents allowing their children under the age of 12 years to operate an OHV on city roads, streets, or highways, parents allowing their children between the ages of 12 and 16 to operate an OHV without an OHV education certificate **AND** not under direct adult supervision, and to any rider under the age of 18 who is not wearing a properly-fitted USDOT approved protective headgear designated for motorized use. Please contact the Police Department with any questions at (435) 884-6881. Grantsville City Police will be issuing citations for these violations.

Dog licenses are now expired. A 30-day grace period is given to renew your license. If you have not renewed your dog license by April 30, 2017, your fees will double!

Grantsville City is in the process of formulating its 2017-2018 budget, which begins on July 1, 2017. With limited revenues and pursuant to the provisions of the Utah Code, the City is requiring any interested person or organization to submit applications for funding (donations) for the 2017-2018 fiscal year to the City prior to **April 28, 2017 at 5:00 p.m.** All requests for funding must be in writing and shall include the amount requested, the proposed use of the funds and a detailed explanation of the benefit the City will receive in return for the donation. The City will prioritize the funding requests and include those that are approved in the proposed budget. Requests should be submitted to Sherrie Broadbent, Finance Director, at 429 East Main Street, Grantsville, Utah 84029 prior to the deadline. Grantsville City will not fund any requests for donations for the 2017-2018 fiscal year unless an application is submitted as required above.
