Grantsville City will hold a Primary Election on Tuesday, August 15th. **Please note the polling location in Grantsville City has changed from the Fire Station to Grantsville High School.** Early voting dates and locations are: Tooele County Clerk/Auditor Office at 47 S Main, Room #318 in Tooele from Aug 1st through Aug 10th from 8am to 6pm. Grantsville Senior Center on Aug 2nd from 9:30am to 11:30am or Aug 11th from 8am to 5pm. More information can be found on our website at www.grantsvilleut.gov.

Two new crosswalks are being installed on main street! A new crosswalk will replace the crosswalk between Park Street and Center Street. This will be pedestrian-activated. New overhead lights will flash red when pedestrians are present, requiring drivers to stop. The second crosswalk will be at Hale Street and Main. This one will be an overhead flashing yellow light when pedestrians are crossing. The goal is to have them installed before school begins on August 22nd. Please make sure you talk to your children about street safety when walking or riding a bike. Drivers, please watch for kids and follow instructions given by crossing guards.

- Clark Street east end
- Bowery Street
- Old Lincoln Hwy south end
- Cooley Street
