Grantsville City will hold a Primary Election on Tuesday, August 15th. **Please note the polling location in Grantsville City has changed from the Fire Station to Grantsville High School.** Early voting dates and locations are: the Tooele County Clerk/Auditor Office, 47 S. Main St. Room #318 in Tooele from Tuesday, August 1st through Thursday, August 10th from 8:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. and Friday, August 11th from 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. and the Grantsville Senior Center, 120 S. Center on Wednesday, August 2nd 9:30 a.m. - 11:30 a.m. More information can be found at our website www.grantsvilleut.gov.

We would like to encourage citizens to clean up any debris that has collected in your yards through the winter. In addition, with all of the rain we have received this spring, we understand the weeds have grown like crazy. Please mow, pull, or get rid of them as soon as possible! Citations may be issued for nuisance violations.

Dates and times for the 4th of July Activities are on the back of this newsletter.

Fireworks are permitted in designated areas only. These areas include Matthews Lane west to the east side of West Street and from Clark Street to Durfee Street. Those subdivisions on the outskirts of the boundary please use the interior portion of the subdivision. If there is a dry vacant weed area close by, do not light fireworks. Prevention at this time is our safest alternative. To prevent a fire from encroaching on your home, keep the vegetation mowed short. According to Utah State Code, fireworks are authorized from July 1st to July 7th, 11:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m., and on July 4th, 11:00 a.m. to Midnight. Fireworks are also authorized from July 21st to July 27th, 11:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.

The Grantsville Police Department will be closing Cherry Street on July 4th from Quirk Street to the East entrance of the high school to ensure the safety of pedestrians and improve access to the park and fireworks display. We suggest that those who are able to carpool or walk to the park and fireworks display do so to help with the flow of traffic and the limited parking availability.

The Parade Route will begin at City Hall. Our parade will travel west on Main Street to Center Street, then south on Center Street to Cherry Street, then east on Cherry Street to the City Park. If you have any question, please feel free to call City Hall at (435) 884-3411 or email LaceyAnn. Please park in parking lots or on streets that are not on the parade route so that people will be able to watch the parade.

The Tooele County Sheriff's Office is requesting information on livestock. The information will be used in the event that Tooele County Sheriff's Office Dispatch Center needs to contact you for law enforcement related incidents. It is important to keep the Sheriff's Office updated on responsible party information in the event that your livestock get out or are involved in an accident.
