Remember to vote on Nov. 7th! Early voting is Oct 24th through Nov. 2nd at the Tooele County Clerk's office in Tooele, from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm. Valid voter ID is required for all voting. Regular voting will be November 7th at the **Grantsville Fire Station** from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm. The city is voting for Mayor, two City Council members, and the Tooele School District levy.

The following statement is the latest on the Tooele Army Depot (TEAD) open detonation (blasting) moving to the South Area.

In 2012, TEAD began the process to obtain permits to conduct open detonations at TEAD. Two separate permits are required: a Hazardous Waste Treatment Permit and a Clean Air Act permit. TEAD received the Clean Air Act Permit approval in August 2017, but the Hazardous Waste Treatment Permit approval still has four steps to be completed. ...continued

The Grantsville City Police Department is participating again this year with the "Shop with a Cop" program. To earn money for the kids, the police department is participating in the "**Tip a Cop**" program. Mark your calendars for Tuesday, December 5th, from 5:00 pm to 9:00 pm at Casa Del Ray. You can also bring in a donation anytime to the police department. We appreciate your support!

...The four steps are;

1. Utah Dept. of Environmental Quality (UDEQ) approval of three documents; Human Health and Ecological Risk Assessments and the Risk Management Plan.
2. UDEQ/TEAD finalizing permit language adding TEADS OD operation to the existing TEADS permit.
3. Approval of completion of a UDEQ-led 45 public comment period.
4. TEAD response to public comments received.

The city is working with the state to encourage them to expedite the process.

Grantsville City obtained a grant from UDOT for more sidewalks. The grant is covering most of the cost at \$195,400 with the city contributing \$8,000. These sidewalks are being installed on the east side of Center Street from Cherry Street to Durfee Street and continuing on the north side of Durfee Street to Park Street. These should be completed around the middle part of November. Please be careful around the construction area. Please encourage your children to use the sidewalks, when they are completed, for a safer walk to and from school.
