## Special Points of Interest:

School is now in session. We want to remind everyone to slow down and take extra precautions during school hours. When a school bus is stopped with the flashers on, it's against the law to pass. Citations will be issued. Our police officers will be patrolling school zones. We make the children our priority and so should you. Let's protect our most precious resource.

Our new sidewalks on Durfee Street and Quirk Street are finished. The City acquired 2 grants for these projects. The Durfee sidewalk project is from a grant awarded from Safe Routes to Schools. They contributed \$233,075.00 to the project and the city contributed \$12,856.00. The Quirk sidewalk project is from a grant awarded from the Transportation Alternative Program. They contributed \$89,846.00 to the sidewalk and the city contributed \$44,923.00. These sidewalks will make it safer for our children to walk to school.

The pedestrian crosswalk projects are scheduled to start Sept. 11th with completion by the end of Sept. Both crosswalks will be pedestrian activated. The crosswalk at Grantsville Elementary School will still have a crossing guard during the school year at the regular times. This project has been in progress for three years. It is a UDOT allocation that cost \$141,855, at no cost to the city.

The Grantsville High School Music Department is hosting a clothing drive fundraiser. They are looking for gently used clothing, shoes, accessories, purses, jewelry, etc. You can bring your donations to GHS on October 16th. Or contact any band or orchestra student you know and they will come to your house and collect your items. You may also call or text 801-381-1864 or 435-260-9080 for a pickup appointment and they will coordinate students to pick items up.

The street repair project will continue in September. Roads that will be effected are:

- Burmester north end
- Burmester south end
- Clark Street east end
- Old Lincoln Hwy south end
- Cooley Street

The total cost for all the roads repaired totaled \$585,675.00.

\*Just a reminder that bulk garbage is not to be put out on the street until the weekend it is scheduled for pick up.

**\*Update on SR-201**

Work continues on SR-201 in Salt Lake City between I-80 and 9200 West. Motorists can expect construction crews in the area Monday through Saturday between the hours of 3 a.m. to 9 p.m. During construction motorists can expect uneven and rough pavement in the project area.

Motorists should expect up to a maximum of 15 minute delays during work hours. Traffic will be impacted during construction times:
