BURN SEASON IS NOT OPEN YET. There are new State Regulations for Residential Open Burning that have been issued by the Division of Air Quality (DAQ) to regulate open burning activities to minimize and ensure that the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) are met. Applicants statewide are required to complete the open burn permit application and **receive an open burn permit by contacting DAQ at (801) 536-4000 or visiting www.airquality.utah.gov.** Due to these new state regulations, open burn permits can no longer be obtained through Grantsville City nor the Fire Department.

Grantsville City is in the process of formulating its 2015-2016 budget, which begins on July 1, 2015. With limited revenues and pursuant to the provisions of the Utah Code, the City is requiring any interested person or organization to submit applications for funding (donations) for the 2015-2016 fiscal year to the City prior to April 24, 2015 at 5:00 p.m. All requests for funding must be in writing and shall include the amount requested, the proposed use of the funds and a detailed explanation of the benefit the City will receive in return for the donation. The City will prioritize the funding requests and include those that are approved in the proposed budget. Requests should be submitted to Sherrie Broadbent, Finance Director, at 429 East Main Street, Grantsville, Utah 84029 prior to the deadline. Grantsville City will not fund any requests for donations for the 2015-2016 fiscal year unless an application is submitted as required above.

EPA added the US Magnesium site to the National Priority List of Superfund sites in 2009. EPA is currently overseeing site investigations carried out by Environmental Resources Management (ERM, a US Magnesium consultant) for the first phase of a complex environmental investigation which will inform risk assessment and cleanup decisions for the site.

The F-401 (Grantsville, Stansbury Bus) is in jeopardy of losing its mid-day service due to low ridership. As citizens we can utilize this service and do everything in our power to prove to UTA we need this service. The F-401 is a bus route that provides local service and connects to other UTA services. The service is unique because residents can use the set course or they can call to schedule the bus to pick them up or drop them off up to ¾ mile from the fixed route. The fare for the standard service at designated bus stops is the same as other local bus or TRAX service and an additional \$1.00 for stops up to ¾ mile off route. Schedules and routes are available at City Hall, Soelberg's and the Grantsville Senior Citizen's Center.
