Fireworks are permitted in designated areas only. These areas are from Matthews Lane west to the east side of West Street, from Clark Street to Durfee Street. Those subdivisions on the outskirts of the boundary please use the interior portion of the subdivision. If there is a dry vacant weed area close by, do not light fireworks. Prevention at this time is our safest alternative. To prevent a fire from encroaching on your home, keep the vegetation mowed short. According to Utah State Code, fireworks are authorized from July 1st to July 7th from 11:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m., on July 4th from 11:00 a.m. to Midnight. Fireworks are also authorized from July 21st to July 27th from 11:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.

In an effort to keep our city clean and friendly, we ask that you remove yard sale signs at the completion of your sale. Please do not place bulk garbage items at the curb until the night prior to your bulk pick up day. One of the complaints we receive the most is that yards become overgrown with weeds and piles of junk. If your neighbor is having trouble maintaining their yard, give them a helping hand. We all live in a beautiful valley; let's do our part to keep it beautiful!

The Grantsville Police Department will be closing Cherry Street on July 4th. Cherry Street will be closed from Quirk Street to the east entrance of the High School to ensure the safety of pedestrians and improve access to the park and fireworks display. We suggest that those who are able to carpool or walk to the park and firework display do so to help with the flow of traffic and the need for parking.

The Parade Route will begin at City Hall. Our parade will travel west on Main Street to Center Street then south on Center Street to Cherry Street then east on Cherry Street to the City Park. We are asking that you not park your vehicles on the streets of the parade route so that people will be able to watch the parade. **Please park in parking lots or on streets that are not on the parade route.**
