The Grantsville Volunteer Fire Department will have its annual open house fundraiser on Thursday, July 26<sup>th</sup>. Please come support our fire department. All donations are welcome. Cost will be individual plates (\$7), family pass of five (\$25), couples (\$14), and kids 12 and under (\$1).

The Tooele Valley Mosquito Abatement District will be controlling the mosquitoes with a product that is sprayed by a truck-mounted fogger. Lighting fireworks is permitted in designated areas only. Those areas are from Matthews Lane west to the east side of West Street, from Clark Street to Durfee Street. Those subdivisions on the outskirts of the boundary please use the interior portion of the subdivision. If there is a dry vacant weed area close by do not light fireworks there. Prevention at this time is our safest alternative. To prevent a fire from encroaching on your home keep the vegetation mowed short. According to Utah State Code, fireworks are authorized from July 1<sup>st</sup> to July 7<sup>th</sup> from 11am to 11pm, on July 4<sup>th</sup> from 11am to Midnight.
