The Tooele County Assessor's office is currently conducting a detailed review in Grantsville for the 2015 tax year. This is a routine analysis of each parcel as required by the Utah State Tax Commission. Over the course of the year all property owners should receive a mail survey. All properties will be visited briefly by a contracted data collector or staff member. The survey and visit are an opportunity to verify and/or correct information needed to generate a reliable appraisal for 2015's property tax valuation. Data collectors should knock and identify themselves with a county-issued ID. They will take a few pictures, ask a couple of questions, and, if needed, take a few measurements. America's top motorcycle road racing riders - including three-time AMA Superbike champ Josh Hayes, J.D. Beach, Cameron Beaubier, Garrett Gerloff, Jake Zemke, Martin Cardenas, Roger Hayden, Melissa Paris, and your phenom Joe Roberts - will visit Miller Motorsports Park on May 24-25, as Round 3 of the GEICO Motorcycle Superbike Showdown presented by Yamaha come to Utah, and admission is just \$6 for adults with kids 12 and under free. Also, don't forget Grantsville residents are always eligible for a 10% discount on karting at the Miller Kart Track with proof of residency.

REMINDER. Any person operating an OHV is subject to the following provisions: (1) Unless otherwise provided for herein, no person under 12 years of age will be allowed to operate an OHV on a Grantsville City road, street or highway designated for OHV use. (2) No person between the ages of 12 and 16 may operate and no owner may give permission to a person between the ages of 12 and 16 to operate an OHV on the designated roads, streets and highways of Grantsville City unless such person is accompanied on another OHV and under the direct visual supervision of an adult 18 years of age or older holding a valid driver's license. OHV operators between the ages of 12 and 16 must possess an OHV education certificate as issued by the Utah Division of Parks and Recreation. (3) All operators 16 years of age and older must possess either a valid operator's license or an OHV education certificate as issued by the Utah Division of Parks and Recreation. (4) All riders under the age of 18 may not operate or ride an all terrain type I vehicle on the system unless the person is wearing a properly-fitted USDOT approved protective headgear designated for motorized use. (5) All users of roads, streets, and highways designated for use by OHV's must obey all traffic and other safety laws and rules. (6) All users of the Grantsville City designated off-highway roads, streets and highways may not operate a vehicle at a speed greater than is reasonable and prudent under the existing conditions, giving regard to the actual and potential hazards then existing, including when: (a) approaching and crossing an intersection or railroad grade crossing; (b) approaching and going around a curve; (c) approaching a hill crest; (d) traveling upon any narrow or winding roadway; (e) special hazards exist due to pedestrians, other traffic, weather or road conditions. (7) Unless otherwise stated herein, even when no special hazard exists, an operator of an OHV will not travel at a speed in excess of the posted or applicable speed limit.

PUBLIC NOTICE OF GRANTSVILLE CITY'S INTENT TO ADJUST SEWER RATES

Over the past several years Grantsville City has been required by state law and federal agency regulations and requirements to upgrade its wastewater treatment facility and has dealt with rising rates of operation due to rising energy costs. These costs have outpaced current user fees leaving this facility underfunded. Grantsville City has made every attempt to absorb these costs.

Grantsville City continually reviews its spending and revenue income throughout the year and has determined that a user fee increase is necessary. Grantsville City's proposed increase for residential use is \$5.00 per month. Grantsville City's proposed increase for non-residential users is a rate of \$1.50 per 1,000 gallons usage added to their current rate of \$20.00 per month. This usage will be calculated by using the water usage during the winter months of November through March. These new rates shall be effective July 1, 2014.

Grantsville City will hold a public hearing on Wednesday, May 7, 2014, at 7:00 pm., and on Wednesday, May 21, 2014, at 7:00 pm., at Grantsville City Hall located at 429 E. Main, Grantsville, Utah. The Grantsville City Council will consider the proposed increase at their regular meeting held on June 4, 2014, at 7:00 p.m. at Grantsville City Hall located at 429 E. Main, Grantsville, Utah. All interested persons are invited to attend and be heard regarding the proposed rate increase.
