The Grantsville City Summer Clean-up and Recycling Roundup will be held Saturday, May 21<sup>st</sup>. Dumpsters will be provided for Grantsville citizens at City Hall (429 E. Main St.), the City Yard (336 W. Main St.), on Worthington Street on the south side of Durfee Street, and Hollywood Park (999 S. Quirk St.) on this day. Dumpsters are for residential use only. Contractors and construction sites are not eligible to use them during this special event. **Absolutely NO household hazardous waste allowed.** Landscaping materials such as rocks, dirt, concrete, and blacktop **CANNOT** be placed in the dumpsters. Please don't leave materials on the ground next to the dumpsters, and never fill the dumpster above the sidewalls. There will be a shred truck for paper document shredding and e-waste recycling available at the high school from 9:00 - 11:00 a.m. E-waste items that will be accepted are cell phones, microwaves, and rechargeable batteries. Items **NOT** accepted include: CRT TV's/Monitors, Projection TV's, DLP TV's, appliances, alkaline batteries, smoke detectors, florescent bulbs, and magnetic media (example VHS tapes).

With the change in seasons, we would like to encourage all citizens to take a look at their property. Now is a great time to clean up debris from the winter months and spray weeds. One of the complaints we receive the most is that yards become overgrown with weeds and piles of junk. If your neighbor is having trouble maintaining their yard, give them a helping hand. When their yard looks nice, yours does too! We all live in a beautiful valley; let's do our part to keep it beautiful!

Grantsville City is in no way involved with the distribution of the green newspaper bags being delivered each week to residents. Please be aware of the following OHV violations which may be cited: Parents allowing their children under the age of 12 years to operate an OHV on City roads, streets, or highways, parents allowing their children between the ages of 12 and 16 to operate an OHV without an OHV education certificate **AND** not under direct adult supervision, and to any rider under the age of 18 who is not wearing a properly-fitted USDOT approved protective headgear designated for motorized use.
