Grantsville City's General Election will be held on Tuesday, November 3rd at the Grantsville Fire Station from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. All voters must present photo ID at the polls in order to cast a ballot. For more information visit www.co.tooele.ut.us/clerk.htm and click on the Elections tab.

Line-up will begin at 5:30 p.m. with the parade starting at 6:00 p.m. The parade will start at City Hall and travel along Main Street to the Fire Station. Now is the time to prepare the heating system in your home for winter weather. Make sure fireplaces and/or wood burning stoves with flue pipes are clean. This will prevent having a chimney fire in your home that could displace your family.

The Grantsville City Police Department is excited to announce that the "Shop with a Cop" program is now accepting donations. This program helps families that are less fortunate by helping to buy things they need and holiday gifts. The children partner with a police officer who takes them in their police car to the Tooele City Wal-Mart. Once at the store the officer escorts them around the store to help them find the things on their list. The children that are involved are selected based on need due to family situations. They are chosen using several different agencies including the Children's Justice Center, the local School District, and Law Enforcement Agencies. You are able to turn in donations with your water bill by sending a separate check. We are now in the hunting season. To prevent any problems with hunting, be very careful in abiding by all of the applicable rules and regulations. Grantsville ordinances allow hunting in the City limits, but prohibit the use of center fire ammunition in handguns and rifles. Hunters are not allowed to discharge a firearm from a vehicle, from, upon or across any highway, at power lines or signs. Hunting is not allowed without written permission from the owner or property manager, within 600 feet of a house, dwelling or any other building or any structure in which a domestic animal is kept or fed, including a barn, poultry yard, corral, feeding pen or stockyard. Hunters are prohibited from entering private property that is cultivated or properly posted without the permission of the owner or the person in charge of the land. A hunter is also trespassing if they refuse to immediately leave private land if requested to do so.

In an effort to keep our city clean and friendly, please do not place bulk garbage items at the curb until the night prior to your bulk pick up day. If your garbage day is Monday or Tuesday, then your bulk pickup day is the 2nd Monday of every month. If your garbage day is Wednesday or Thursday, it is the 4th Monday of every month. **It is a Class "C" Misdemeanor to unlawfully deposit solid waste on the street without permission from Grantsville City.**

The Salt Lake Community Action Weatherization Program is available to help low-income families in our area permanently reduce bills for heating and cooling. Weatherization agencies install cost-effective measures to reduce home energy consumption. Information pamphlets are available at City Hall and www.grantsvilleut.gov on the home page.
