

Grantsville Citizens,

I am pleased to announce that Grantsville City has entered into negotiations with Ace Disposal to provide our citizens with a bi-weekly recycling program. Citizens will be delivered a blue recycling receptacle which will allow for plastics, metal, paper products and cardboard to be recycled. These items will need to be empty but will not have to be rinsed, cleaned or sorted prior to placing them in the recycling receptacle. Green waste and glass will not be recycled. It is estimated that 75% of our waste can be recycled. The cost of this service will be approximately \$4.75 to \$5.50 per month, a cost that is cheaper than a second waste receptacle currently. The pick-up of the recycling receptacle will be every other week on the same day as your waste service.

Citizens will be able to replace their second receptacle if they so choose. The more waste we recycle, the more we will save. Grantsville City will receive no less than \$7.00 and up to \$45.00 for each ton of recycled material processed. Grantsville City currently pays \$42.00 per ton in tipping fees at the landfill. For every ton we send to be recycled, the City does not pay tipping fees.

All citizens will automatically be enrolled in this program unless they choose to opt-out. The opt-out period will be from March 1, 2013 through April 15, 2013. The Grantsville City Council will hold public hearings on the recycling program at their regular meetings on March 6, 2013 and March 20, 2013 at 7:00 pm. The City will determine after the opt-out period, based on the percentage of homes remaining in the service area, if this program is viable for both the City and Ace Disposal. The projected start date for this service is August 1, 2013. Once service begins, citizens will only be allowed to opt-out on an annual basis between July 1 and July 31 of each year. Residents may begin service at any time.

If you choose to opt-out, please detach the lower perforated slip from this letter and return it to City Hall and your address will be removed from this service. You may also opt-out by emailing "I, _____, request my address: _____ be removed from the recycling program." to recycling@grantsvilleut.gov.

Grantsville City Recycle Program Opt-Out

How It Works

Step 1: Recyclables are collected from your home or business and taken to a recycle facility.




Step 2: The sorting begins by moving along a conveyor belt.



Step 3: Recyclables are divided accordingly through multiple screens and sorters. Cardboard is removed, then the different types of paper: shredded, newspaper, and magazines. Other material such as plastic and metals are sorted with the help of optical lenses and magnets. To make sure this process remains effective and efficient a crew of people is still needed to sort what items the machine may have missed.

Step 4: Once the recyclables are sorted, they are made into bails of paper, metals, and cardboard. The bailers are then sent to the various mills to be turned into new products.

Single Stream Recycling

Benefits of Single Stream Recycling

- 1) A recycling program where plastic, cardboard, paper, and metals can be placed into one container for your convenience.
- 2) Single Stream Recycling will help reduce the amount of recyclables going to the landfill every day, which will keep our landfills from filling up too quickly.
- 3) It takes 30% less energy to produce a product from recyclables.
- 4) Recyclables reduce the amount of raw materials needed to make a new product. Reducing business operating costs.
- 5) Recycling bin is cheaper than a second trash bin.


Unacceptable Items for Single Stream

- * Batteries
- * Bubble wrap
- * Carpet & padding
- * China & ceramics
- * Clothing
- * Cookware
- * Dirty Styrofoam
- * Disposable diapers
- * Food & liquid waste
- * Glass (any kind)
- * Hazardous Waste
- * Light bulbs & tubes
- * Paint cans
- * Plastic buckets
- * Plastic tarps
- * Plastic toys
- * Print cartridges
- * Toner cartridges
- * Trash & yard waste
- * Used paper plates & cups
- * Waxed/plastic coated paper
- * Window Blinds
- * Wood & building material



Guidelines for Single Stream Recycling

- * Do not force materials into recycling container. It may not empty completely.
- * Please be sure all containers are cleaned of food and liquid prior to recycling.
- * Cardboard may be broken down if needed to fit in recycling container. Do not force into can.
